10-DAY & 16-DAY JOURNEY OF A LIFETIME TO ISRAEL AND GREECE

DAY 1, MARCH 10, TUESDAY—DEPART NORTH AMERICA

Tour members depart on our flight to Europe. After take-off *en route* to the Holy Land, we will be served dinner.

DAY 2, MARCH 11, WEDNESDAY—ARRIVE TEL AVIV/NETANYA

After a brief touchdown in Europe, we arrive in Tel Aviv where we are met by our agent who assists us through customs and security. We are then transferred to our hotel in Netanya, right on the beautiful Mediterranean Sea.

DAY 3, MARCH 12, THURSDAY—CAESAREA/MEGIDDO/NAZARETH/TIBERIAS

Today we depart for Galilee, visiting the following biblical sites: Caesarea (Acts 9 and 25), Mt. Carmel (1 Kgs. 18), Megiddo (Armageddon; 1 Kgs. 9:15; Rev. 16:16), Nazareth (Luke 1 and 2), Cana (John 2) and Tiberias (John 6:23). We end the day on top of Mr. Arbel, overlooking the Sea of Galilee.

DAY 4, MARCH 13, FRIDAY—GALILEE/UPPER JORDAN/GOLAN HEIGHTS

There is nothing quite like watching a sunrise on the Sea of Galilee from your hotel. We begin our day with an inspiring boat ride on the Sea of Galilee in a wooden replica of the "Jesus Boat." We sail to Nof Ginnosar where we will see a 1st century boat. Today will include many biblical sites along the shore of the Sea of Galilee and in the Upper Jordan Valley: e.g. Capernaum (Matt. 4:13), Mount of Beatitudes (Matt. 5–7), Tabgha (Feeding of 5,000; Mark 6), Church of Peter of Primacy (John 21), Magdala (Matt. 15:39; Luke 8:2); Caesarea Philippi (Panaes; Mark 8:27), view Mt. Hermon (Deut. 3:8), and the Border of Lebanon (Josh. 11:17), Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

DAY 5, MARCH 14, SATURDAY—BETH SHAN/JERICO/MT. OF OLIVES/JERUSALEM

Today we begin with an Optional: Baptism in the River Jordan as we head towards Jerusalem. The highway will take us to many of the following biblical sites: Beth Shan (1 Sam. 31:10); and Jericho, the ancient city where the wall came tumbling down (Josh. 2–6; Mark 10:46; Luke 19:1). The road from Jericho to Jerusalem is an ascent of 4,000 feet in 13 miles. We get our first glimpse of Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives, beholding a breath-taking panorama of the Holy City. We walk down the "Palm Sunday" route to the Garden of Gethsemane. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

DAY 6, MARCH 15, SUNDAY—TEMPLE MOUNT/VIA DOLOROSA/HOLY SEPULCHRE BETHLEHEM

Our day begins with a visit to the Temple Mount. We will enter Jerusalem through the Dung Gate, and walk to the holiest site in the whole Jewish world, the Western Wall (Wailing Wall) of Herod's temple. Beyond the wall lies the 35-acre temple area purchased by King David (2 Sam. 24:18–25). On this site now stands the magnificent Dome of the Rock (the third holiest shrine in all Islam) and the El-Aksa Mosque. From the temple area, we make our way to St. Stephen's Gate, St. Anne's Crusader Church, Pools of Bethesda, the Sister of Zion Convent (to see the Pavement where Jesus stood as he was being tried by Pilate), Ecco Homo Arch, and then follow the Via Dolorosa to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the ancient Cardo. (Note: A scheduled walk through the "Western Wall Tunnel" will also be planned.)

This afternoon we will pass by Rachel's tomb on the outskirts of Bethlehem, and visit the Church of the Nativity and Shepherd's Field. You will be fascinated by your visit to the Israel Museum and the model of Jerusalem (1 to 50 scale model of Herodian Jerusalem as it would have appeared in Jesus' time). Here we will also see the Shrine of the Book where some of the Dead Sea Scrolls are displayed. A visit to Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum concludes the day.

DAY 7, MARCH 16, MONDAY—JERICO/QUMRAN/EIN GEDI/MASADA/DEAD SEA/JERUSALEM

Leaving Jerusalem, we will descend down to the Dead Sea and the wilderness of Judah. Our first stop will be Qumran and the possible settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls.

Following the road south along the western shore of the Dead Sea, we will stop at Ein Gedi where David hid from King Saul, and everyone will have an opportunity to float in the Dead Sea, the lowest spot on the earth. Continuing south, the next stop is Masada, where we will ascend high upon the wilderness mountain by way of the cable car to the fortress built by King Herod. Here we survey the ruins of the fortifications, waterworks, synagogue, temples and palaces. An optional walk down the snake path will be offered. We travel back to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

DAY 8, MARCH 17, TUESDAY—THE TEMPLE MOUNT/SOUTHERN WALL EXCAVATIONS/CITY OF DAVID/GARDEN TOMB

We begin the day by walking through the southern wall excavations where we will stand at the southern entrance to the Herodian Temple. Here, we will see the ancient boulders of the Temple and sit on the steps where Jesus no doubt taught. During the noon hour, we will visit The Shoreship Shop, where Moshe, an Orthodox Jew, will share an informative talk about his Jewish faith. In the afternoon, we will also visit the City of David, the ancient part of the city that dates back to the Old Testament. After seeing the excavations, there will be an optional walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel (II Chr. 29–32), a 1,720 foot tunnel that ends at the Pool of Siloam (John 9). Late in the afternoon we will visit the Garden Tomb with an optional communion service. Farewell dinner at our hotel as we bid farewell to our fellow travelers that will be ending their tour and return home.

DAY 9, MARCH 18, WEDNESDAY—JERUSALEM/TEL-AVIV/VIENNA

For those doing just the Israel tour, a morning without a planned program. Time to visit other places in and around the Old City, or revisit the places of most interest. Return for a last look within the walls of the Old City where bargaining is a must when you shop. Once again the day will bring us lasting memories of the Old and New Testament, a renewal of our faith, and a greater understanding of the life and ministry of our Lord. In early afternoon, we will travel to Ben Gurion Airport for our flight from Tel Aviv to Vienna. Upon arrival in Vienna, we board the shuttle and transfer to our hotel for the night.

DAY 10, MARCH 19, THURSDAY—VIENNA/U.S.

We meet in the lobby early morning as we transfer back to the airport for our Austrian flight #93 departing at 10:50 A.M., arriving same day.

EXTENSION: 7-DAY GREECE, INCLUDING A SPECTACULAR THREE DAY ISLAND CRUISE (with all cruise excursions included)

DAY 9, MARCH 18, WEDNESDAY—JERUSALEM/ATHENS

Early morning rise as we depart our hotel to the Ben Gurion airport for our Olympic Air flight to Athens arriving at their new airport 8:10 A.M. Upon arrival in Athens, we go to the baggage carousel and pick up our luggage, then exit the secured area where we're met by our guide and escorted to an awaiting motor coach.

DAY 10, MARCH 19, THURSDAY—ATHENS/CITY TOUR

Following breakfast we board our bus for sightseeing of the Acropolis and visit Mars Hill where the Apostle Paul preached (Acts 17, 16–34) to the City Council. God blessed the preaching of Paul; Dionysius, a member of the council, Damaris and others believed. Next we enter the Propylea and visit the temple of the Wingless Victory and the incredible Parthenon, considered the world's most perfectly proportioned edifice. To the left of the Parthenon is the beautiful Erechtheum. Our Athens tour continues as we see the House of Parliament, Tomb of the "Unknown Soldier," Theatre of Dionysos, Odeon of Herodes, Atticus and the ancient Agora (market).

DAY 11, MARCH 20, FRIDAY—ATHENS/PIRAEUS/SAIL ON THREE-DAY CRUISE

This morning we transfer to Piraeus to board our cruise ship, which departs at noon. Lunch will be served *en route*. Weather and time permitting there will be a short stop at Mykonos with its dazzling white houses, narrow paved streets, shops and windmills. Dinner is served on board the ship.

10-DAY & 16-DAY JOURNEY OF A LIFETIME TO ISRAEL AND GREECE

DAY 12, MARCH 21, SATURDAY—RHODES

We disembark the ship and board our bus for our visit of the island. Rhodes is the largest island of the Dodecanese with a population of 98,181. On the Apostle Paul's third missionary journey, after meeting with the elders of Ephesus at Miletus and saying goodbye to them, he sails to Cos and then to Rhodes (Acts 21, 1). As his ship sailed into the harbor of Rhodes, Paul saw the remains of the Colossus, one of the Seven Wonders of the ancient world. The Rhodians maintain that the Apostle Paul stayed in their city and preached, bringing many people into the new faith. We are told that before Paul left, he appointed Prochorus, one of the seven deacons (Acts 6,5), Bishop of the Island. Another local tradition has the Apostle's ship landing in the small harbor near Lindos, referred to even today as "St. Paul's Harbor." St. Silas, a prophet and leader among the brethren (Acts 15, 22-23) is revered by the Rhodians. St. Silas proved the power of Jesus Christ by healing a paralytic, whereupon the villagers accepted the Christian faith and built a church in honor of their patron.

DAY 13, MARCH 22, SUNDAY—KUSADASI/EPHESUS/PATMOS

We have an early breakfast this morning as we arrive in Kusadasi at 7:00 A.M. We take the excursion to Ephesus in order to see the best site in all of Turkey! We will visit the ancient city of Ephesus where Paul spent three years of his ministry (Acts 19-20; 1). Ephesus was a rich commercial center like Corinth. The great marble temple of Artemis was the pride of Ephesus and one of the world's Seven Wonders. The city annually played host to hordes of people from all over during the festival of Artemis. In this setting, Paul preached the Gospel. We'll visit St. John's Church built by Justinian in 527-565. Some believe the Apostle John wrote his Gospel from Ephesus and, having returned after two years of exile on Patmos, that he is also buried here. Walking along one of the main streets we will see ruins of the Library of Celsus, the Agora, and the Great Theater that seated 24,000 (Acts 19,

23-41). Some early Christian traditions believe that Jesus' mother, Mary lived and died here in Ephesus; we'll visit the Church of the Virgin Mary. We next sail for Patmos, arriving after lunch at 4:00 P.M. On Patmos we will visit the cave where St. John wrote the Book of Revelation. We'll also see the Monastery of the Apocalypse and the Monastery of St. John, which have fine frescoes, priceless icons, ecclesiastical ornaments, pendants and beautiful embroideries. We sail about 7:00 P.M. Dinner is served on board. An unforgettable day!

DAY 14, MARCH 23, MONDAY—PIRAEUS/CORINTH/ATHENS

We disembark from our cruise in Piraeus, where we are met by our agent who assists us through general customs and formalities before transferring to our motor coach. Drive along the Saronic Gulf, across the Corinth Canal through rolling vineyards to ancient Corinth, which was the most beautiful and frivolous city of Roman Greece. Visit the Doric-style temple of Apollo, marketplace museum, the Fountain of Pirene, the Bema of St. Paul and Agora. Return to Athens late afternoon. Free time to explore places such as the famous Plaka, before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 15, MARCH 24, TUESDAY—ATHENS/VIENNA

Time for a leisurely breakfast, time to pack and relax before we meet in the lobby for our drive back to the airport. Our Austrian flight # 802 departs at 1455 to Vienna arriving late afternoon. We will board the shuttle buses and transfer to our hotel. After dinner, we'll have the option to explore Vienna on our own.

DAY 16, MARCH 25, WEDNESDAY—VIENNA/U.S.

Early morning transfer to the airport for our flight home arriving back same day. What an unforgettable trip.

TOUR CONDITIONS

This tour is based on rates, tariffs and ground costs in effect May 2008 at the time of tour quotation and subject to future ARC and IATA fare increases, carrier fuel surcharges, and possible land increase costs in effect at the time the tour operates and subject to change without notice.

LAND TRANSPORTATION: As specified in the respective tour itineraries. Where motor coaches are specified, these are modern, large-windowed, air-conditioned/heated vehicles designed especially for sightseeing. The cost of the land arrangements as outlined in this brochure is based on a busload ranging from 26/30 tour participants as available locally.

HOTELS: As specified in brochure. The tour price is based on shared accommodation in twin-bedded room with private shower or bath. A limited number of single rooms are available at additional supplements stated in brochure. Single rooms when available are often smaller than doubles. Tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single rate.

MEALS: As per tour brochure. In-flight meals as per the airline's normal meal service policies.

SIGHTSEEING: As specified in each itinerary, including the services of a local multilingual guide. (Right is reserved to vary the sequence of sightseeing programs, or to make substitutions if necessitated by circumstances beyond our control.)

TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Included in each city abroad between airports, rail stations, piers, and hotels and vice versa. Portage includes the handling of one normal piece of luggage per person. Additional pieces (including garment bags or similar) may be handled at additional charges and collected upon arrival abroad. Free allowance for checked baggage aboard airlines is 44 pounds (Seasoned travelers have found it convenient to use one piece of luggage only.) A special bag tag for quick identification is also provided. Carry-on bag must fit the dimensions of 9 in. by 14 in. by 22 in.

INCLUDED IN PRICE OF BASIC STANDARD PROGRAM: Round trip airfare, transfers with group to and from overseas airports and piers; shared double room in first class hotels; two meals daily; English speaking guide; transportation and entrance fees to sites to be visited. Of course, your Tour Hosts will be happy to help you obtain the necessary forms for passport application.

DOCUMENTATION: U.S. citizens require a valid passport for international travel.

RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

RESERVATIONS may be secured upon payment of a deposit in the amount per person, as specified in the tour brochure. We recommend this be done far in advance of departure to allow adequate time to secure passports, visas and other documents.

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$300 per person is due upon confirmation, and full payment is required 95 days (12/5/2008) prior to departure. Final payment received 94-69 days prior, add \$45 to tour price. 68-26 days add \$75 to tour price. Within the last 25 days, add a total of \$100 to the tour price. Final documents will not be released until receipt of full payment. Extraordinary mail charges required by late booking, changes, or late payments must be borne by the passenger or tour host. Naturally, Creative Travel Partners, Inc. of Prospect Heights Illinois does not agree to provide any services until full payment is received.

LAND CANCELLATIONS: In the event of cancellation from day of registration to 95 days prior to departure there is a \$100 per person non-refundable administrative fee. Thereafter the following charges apply 94-45 days prior to departure the charge is \$150; 44-31 days the charge is 55% of total cost of the tour; 30-15 days prior to departure the charge is 75% of the total cost of the tour; 14 days prior to departure the charge is 100% of total cost of the tour. No shows or cancellations after date of departure, no refund whatsoever. All refund claims must be received in writing.
