14 DAYS JOURNEY OF A LIFETIME THROUGH THE LANDS OF THE BIBLE

DAY 01 – SATURDAY– OCTOBER 23 - DEPART FOR CAIRO

We meet for the first time today at New York "JFK" airport for our non stop flight to Cairo, Egypt.

DAY 02 – SUNDAY – OCTOBER 24 - ARRIVE IN CAIRO

Upon arrival at the Cairo International airport, we will be met by our land agent who assists us through customs and security. this afternoon. We transfer to our hotel over the beautiful Nile River for dinner and overnight in Cairo.

DAY 03 – MONDAY – OCTOBER 25 – CAIRO - GREAT PYRAMIDS & SPHINX – SAKKARA

Today's sightseeing will include a tour of the great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx. Then a visit to the fantastic Egyptian Museum containing the treasures of King Tutankhamen. The afternoon includes sightseeing of the Necropolis of Sakkara containing the funerary monuments from various periods of Egyptian history. View the Step Pyramid of King Zoser. Optional night walk along Nile River. Overnight in Cairo.

DAY 04 –TUESDAY – OCTOBER 26 - CAIRO- LUXOR - CAIRO

We board an early flight for a spectacular day in Luxor, 500 miles south of Cairo. Upon arrival, we will visit the Valley of the Kings and Queens on the west bank of the Nile River. After lunch, we embark on the excursion to the East Bank of the Nile to see the famous Temples of Karnak and Luxor. We depart and fly back to Cairo in time for dinner and overnight.

DAY 05 –WEDNESDAY – OCTOBER 27 - CAIRO -NORTHERN SINAI - TABA BORDER- EILAT

Following breakfast, we bid farewell to this ancient city and travel by bus and head east towards the Israeli -Egyptian border of Taba. Cross under the Suez Canal and travel along the northern region of the Sinai Desert arriving in time to now cross the border into Israel. Once in Eilat, we will enjoy the Underwater observatory of the Red Sea. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Eilat.

DAY 06 – THURSDAY – OCTOBER 28 - SOUTHERN BORDER CROSSING IN JORDAN - DAY TRIP TO PETRA - EILAT

Early in the morning we cross into Jordan. We meet our Jordanian agents and guide for a wonderful day in Petra, the "Rose Red City half as old as time." This ancient Edomite and Nabatean capital is an amazing experience to encounter! We'll see the Spectacular "city of the dead," with its famed gorge, ancient streets, Temples, dwelling places and tombs, carved in the solid rock. Then we arrive at El-Ji Post, and continue the one-mile journey on horseback, or walk, passing through the famous Siq (the natural gorge) and arrive at the Treasury. In the afternoon, will have the opportunity to visit Roman Temple Ruins of Roman City, Nabatean Judgment Hall, Palace Tombs, famous Urn Temple, and Roman Amphitheater. An optional walk up to the High Place will be made available. At the close of the day, we drive back to the southern border, crossing back into Israel. Overnight once again in Eilat.

DAY 07 –FRIDAY – OCTOBER 29 - MASADA - BEIT SHEAN – TIBERIAS

This morning we drive north to Masada, our first stop of the day. At Masada, we take the cable car to the top, visiting Herod's mountain bunker and the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against Rome. After we descend back from the top of Masada by cable car we re-board our bus and drive north along the Western shores of the Dead Sea. From here, we continue our drive along the coastline of the Dead Sea. We continue north along the Jordan Valley. We stop at Beit Shean, a city mentioned in the Old Testament in regard to King Saul's death. The largeness of the Roman city of Beit Shean will impress you, complete with a columned Roman street, mosaics, and a theater. Overnight in Tiberias.

DAY 08 – SATURDAY – OCTOBER 30 - SEA OF GALILLE – GOLAN HEIGHTS

We begin the morning with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee as we sail to Nof Ginnosar, the location of a 1st century fishing boat similar to what was used in Jesus' day. We then visit Capernaum where we visit the synagogue. Continuing on to Tabgha (short for Heptapagon, "seven springs") to view the mosaics in the Church of the Loaves and Fishes. We then ascend the Mt. of Beatitudes where Jesus preached the "Sermon on the Mount," taking time to reflect upon His kingdom principles. In the afternoon, we head north to the Golan Heights. We travel on an ancient trade route as we pass Hazor and then go on Dan. Here, we walk along the nature preserve path, to the ancient city of Dan. Close by is Caesarea Philippi (Banias), where Peter answered Jesus' question, "*Who do you say*

that I am?" Our route then takes us back on top of the Golan Heights to the east side of the Sea of Galilee. Overnight in Tiberias.

DAY 09 – SUNADY – OCTOBER 31 – TIBERIAS -JORDAN RIVER BAPTISM - EIN HAROD – MEGIDDO- CARMEL- CAESAREA - JERUSALEM

This morning we begin with a baptism in the Jordan River. From here we head to Nazareth where we view the city from the "precipice" from which Jesus was almost thrown. We continue into the Jezreel Valley to Megiddo (*har meggido* in Hebrew), which gave its name to Armageddon. Our day continues as we ascend Mt. Carmel, site of Elijah's confrontation with the prophets of Baal. Descending the mountain, we are on the road again, as we drive toward Caesarea, nestled between the banana groves and the sand-skirted sea. We enter Caesarea Maritima to explore this Roman bridgehead to the East, which became the Christian springboard to the West. We end the day by driving to Jerusalem. We enjoy dinner at our hotel in Jerusalem and an optional "orientation walk" of the Old City. Overnight in Jerusalem.

DAY 10 –MONDAY – NOVEMBER 1 - JERUSALEM – BETHLEHEM - JERUSALEM

Following an optional morning walk, we start the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt.Of Olives. We then follow the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as the Dominus Flevit ("the Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, we walk downhill to Gethsemane, where we take time to meditate on the Gospel text. From here we enter the Old City where we first will visit the Pools of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church, perfectly preserved from the Crusader period – with remarkable acoustics. We then follow the Way of the Cross (Via Dolorosa) to the Holy Sepulcher, stopping along the way to consider all what Christ endured on his way to His crucifixion. In the afternoon, we head into Bethlehem. We pass by Rachel's Tomb on they way to Shepherds' Field and the Church of the Nativity. From there we drive back out to West Jerusalem where we visit the Jerusalem Model of the 2nd Temple Period. We drive back to our hotel for dinner and overnight in Jerusalem. An optional night walk ends the evening.

DAY 11 –TUESDAY – NOVEMBER 2 - WILDERNESS OF JUDAH – JERUSALEM

We return to the Wilderness of Judah today. Our first stop will be Jericho. Here, we visit the tel of this oldest city and view the traditional mountain Jesus' temptation. We'll also see the area where "*the walls came tumblin' down.*" Our next stop will be Ein Gedi. We will walk back to the waterfalls area. Along the way, we hope to see the coney and ibex, animals that reside in this desolate area of Israel. From here it's on to Qumran and the possible settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Following lunch, we'll enjoy a nice relaxing float in the Dead Sea. We'll end the day with a visit to Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum. We travel back to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner another optional walk.

DAY 12 –WEDNESDAY – NOVEMBER 3 - JERUSALEM

Following an optional morning walk, today we enter the Old City through the Dung Gate. We walk up to the Western Wall Judaism's holiest site, the Temple Mount. We walk through the southern wall excavations where we will stand at the southern entrance to the Herodian Temple. Here, we will see the ancient boulders of the Temple and sit on the steps where Jesus no doubt taught. We then ascend to the Temple Mount, the location of the Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque. We then visit the City of David and take an optional adventurous walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel (1,700 feet long). We end the day with a Communion Service at the Garden Tomb. Return to our hotel for dinner. An optional walk ends the evening.

DAY 13 – THURSDAY – NOVEMBER 4 - JERUSALEM

We enjoy a free day in Jerusalem. Pastor DeLancey will help orient you to visit other sites within the Old City, or shop. A tour of The Upper Room, Caiphas' House, and Oscar Shindler's grave will be offered. It will be a special day of adventure, rest, and relaxation. After dinner, we board our bus to Tel Aviv for our night flight home.

DAY 14 – FRIDAY – NOVEMBER 5 – ARRIVE – U.S.A

The close of an unforgettable tour, as we arrive back in the States. Praise be to God for a life-changing experience!

This tour is based on rates, tariffs and ground costs in effect January 2010 at the time of tour quotation and subject to future ARC and IATA fare increases, carrier fuel surcharges, and possible land increase costs in effect at the time the tour operates and subject to change without notice.

LAND TRANSPORTATION: As specified in the respective tour itineraries. Where motor coaches are specified, these are modern, large-windowed, air-conditioned/heated vehicles designed especially for sightseeing. The cost of the land arrangements as outlined in this brochure is based on a busload ranging from 15/25 tour participants as available locally.

HOTELS: As specified in brochure. The tour price is based on shared accommodation in twin-bedded room with private shower or bath. RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

RESERVATIONS may be secured upon payment of a deposit in the amount per person, as specified in the tour brochure. We recommend this be done far in advance of departure to allow adequate time to secure passports, visas and other documents.

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$500 per person is due upon confirmation, and full payment is required 98 days (July 19, 2010) prior to departure. Final payment received 97-69 days prior, add \$45 to tour price; 68-26 days add \$75 to tour price. Within the last 25 days, add a total of \$100 to the tour price. Final documents will not be released until receipt of full payment. Extraordinary mail charges required by late booking, changes, or late payments must be borne by the passenger or tour host. LAND CANCELLATIONS: In the event of cancellation from day of registration to 98 days prior to departure there is a \$150 per person non-refundable administrative fee.
